### **TWO YOUNG WOMEN CHARGED IN ROBBERY AND ASSAULT**

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has charged two women, an 18-year-old and 19-year-old, in connection with a robbery and assault that occurred on Monday.

**Angela May Aguilera** (dob: 07-13-86) and **Stephanie Lynn Williams** (dob: 10-19-87) are each charged with *aggravated robbery* (F3) and *first-degree assault* (F3).

On December 12, 2005 a man was selling jewelry on the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall near 16<sup>th</sup> and Stout when he was approached by two young women. The charges allege that they stole a ring, boarded a light rail train to get away, and then stabbed the victim, a 34-year-old man, when he followed them and demanded the ring back. The victim was able to flag down a Denver police officer for help.

Aguilera and Williams remain in custody in the Denver County Jail. Bond has been set at \$50,000. They are scheduled to appear in Denver County Court, room 12T, on Monday, December 19, 2005 at 9 a.m. to be formally advised of the charges.

The presumptive range for sentencing on a class 3 felony is up to 12 years in prison.
