****All charges against Reynaldo Macias and Hector Pulido-Cervantes were dismissed by the District Attorney in August 2005 and the case was closed.**

TWO MEN CHARGED IN LO DO ASSAULTS**

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has formally charged two men in connection with the unlawful sexual contact of two women last weekend.

Hector Pulido-Cervantes (DOB: 11-21-83) is charged with *impersonating a peace officer* (F6) and *unlawful sexual contact* (M1).

Reynaldo Macias (DOB: 01-09-80) is charged with *second-degree kidnapping* (F4) and *unlawful sexual contact* (M1).

Pulido-Cervantes and Macias approached two women in a lower downtown restaurant in the early morning hours of February 5, 2005. The charges allege that Pulido-Cervantes claimed he was an undercover police officer and that he had unlawful sexual contact with a 21-year-old woman. The charges also allege that Macias forced a 31-year-old woman into a car in the parking lot and had unlawful sexual contact with her. The women were able to get away and flag down a Denver police officer for help.

Macias will be advised of the charges on February 11, 2005 in Denver County Court, room 12T. He remains in custody in the Denver County Jail; his bond was set at \$100,000.

Pulido-Cervantes posted a \$3,000 bond and will be advised of the charges on February 23, 2005 in Denver County Court, room 12T, February 23, 2005 at 9:00 a.m.

*The filing of a criminal charge is merely a formal accusation that an individual(s) committed a crime(s) under Colorado laws. A defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty. See Colo. RPC 3.6
