WOMAN INVOLVED IN DRIVE-BY SHOOTING SENTENCED

The woman accused of orchestrating a drive-by shooting that left two young girls with gunshot wounds last summer has been sentenced.

Natalie McFarlane (DOB: 01-25-86) was sentenced to 20 years in prison for her guilty plea to *first-degree assault*.

McFarlane was the last of three co-defendants to be sentenced in connection with a shooting that injured two young sisters as they were sleeping in their home in August 2005.

McFarlane apologized to the family as she appeared for sentencing in front of Denver District Court Judge Christina Habas.

Andreas Rubio, who fired the shots that hit the girls, was sentenced to 180 years in prison. Terra Ramirez was sentenced to 10 years in prison.
