MAN SENTENCED AFTER BREAKING INTO COP'S HOME

A man who broke into the home of a Denver police officer on the morning of October 29, 2006, has

been sentenced today.

Dustin Mertz (DOB: 05-22-88) was sentenced today after he pleaded guilty in July to *first-degree*

criminal trespassing (F5), and to a lesser charge of third-degree assault (M1).

He was sentenced to two years probation on a deferred judgment, 100 hours of community service

and \$594.00 of restitution. He was also sentenced to nine months in the Denver County Jail with

work release privileges.

Mertz was shot by the officer with a less-than-lethal force shotgun after breaking into the home.
