CITY WORKER CHARGED

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has formally charged a city worker following allegations that he posed as a juvenile probation officer and contributed to the delinquency of two juveniles.

Richard de Olivas Sena y Cordova Real (dob: 06-11-62) is charged with two counts of *contributing to the delinquency of a minor* (F4), *criminal impersonation* (F6) and *unlawful sexual contact* (F4).

The charges allege that in February and March of this year De Olivas unlawfully posed as a juvenile probation officer, provided alcohol and marijuana to a juvenile, and coerced the juvenile to have sexual intercourse with an adult female. The charges further allege he provided alcohol to a second juvenile.

De Olivas is a manager in the Workforce Assessment and Training Unit of Denver's Office of Economic Development. He was immediately placed on investigatory leave. Additional investigation is also underway by the Denver Police Department's Missing and Exploited Person's Unit into any additional contact with teenagers.

De Olivas was arrested on March 16, 2009 and was released on \$35,000 bond. He is scheduled to appear in Denver County Court on April 8, 2009 at 9 a.m. to be formally advised of the charges.
