WOMAN GETS PRISON FOR ID THEFT, CANCER LIE

A Denver District Court judge handed down a significant prison term today to a woman who committed identity theft and then lied to the court about having cancer in an attempt to influence the outcome of her case.

Terrie Mauldin (dob: 12-26-64) pleaded guilty earlier to one count of identity theft (F4) in a scam in which she ripped off a small business owner and his investor whom she had promised to help. She pleaded guilty today to one count of attempting to influence public servant for falsely representing to the Court that she had ovarian cancer in an attempt to delay her sentencing and reduce the penalty she faced for ID theft.

Denver District Court Judge Michael Mullins sentenced Mauldin to the maximum of 12 years for each count, but ordered them to be served concurrently for a total of 12 years in the Colorado Department of Corrections.
