“BUMP & RUN” BANDIT FORMALLY CHARGED

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has formally charged a 43-year-old man accused of being the so-called “bump and run” bandit with an initial robbery charge today, which begins the process of returning him to Colorado.

Ronald Davis (dob: 05-30-68) is charged today with one count of aggravated robbery (F3) in connection with a robbery that occurred earlier in May. Additional charges related to other cases are expected once Davis has returned to Denver.

Davis was wanted in connection with a series of robberies in the Denver metro area that included a May 1, 2011 robbery in which the victim’s car was bumped from behind at a stop sign. The victim was approached by the driver of the other car, who stole her purse at knifepoint.

Davis was identified as a suspect by the Denver Police Department earlier in June; he was arrested in New York last Saturday and remains in custody there pending extradition. A Denver court date has not yet been set.
