FIVE CHARGED IN TEEN EXPLOITATION CASE

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has formally charged five people in connection with the trafficking and pimping of a 13-year-old girl. The charges are the result of an 8-month investigation by the Denver Police Department and the FBI Rocky Mountain Innocence Lost Task Force.

Cyril “Jazz” Packer (dob: 09-06-85) and **Desiree “Dez” Gallimore** (dob: 06-12-89) are both charged with trafficking in children (F2), pandering of a child (F3), inducement of child prostitution (F3), procurement of a child (F3) and other felony counts.

Socrates “Chrome” Packer (dob: 08-13-82) is charged with pandering of a child (F3), inducement of child prostitution (F3), procurement of a child (F3), contributing to the delinquency of a minor (F4) and sexual assault on a child (F4).

Mack McCray (dob:03-19-71) is charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor (F4) and **Earl Williams** (dob: 07-25-88) is charged with inducement of child prostitution (F3), contributing to the delinquency of a minor (F4) and being an habitual criminal.

The charges allege that Williams approached the 13-year-old runaway last year and introduced her to McCray and Socrates Packer, who is also accused of sexually assaulting her. The charges further allege that Cyril Packer and Desiree Gallimore made the victim available for prostitution in locations in the Denver and Colorado Springs areas over a period of time. McCray is accused of assisting by transporting her to a location in furtherance of later acts of prostitution. All five defendants are in custody and will appear in Denver County Court next week to be advised of the charges (except McCray who is in custody in Oklahoma.)
