ROSE ANDOM CENTER SCORES WITH DENVER BRONCOS

The Denver Broncos have announced a new partnership with Colorado's first family justice center - Denver's Rose Andom Center. In making the announcement today, the Broncos have pledged a \$150,000 contribution and are committed to an ongoing collaboration to help get the center completed and open in 2015.

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey, who has been a long-time champion of the Rose Andom Center, applauded the announcement today saying, "The support of the home team means so much. The Broncos are not only helping with their initial contribution, but they are rallying their partners to help get this center finished. They know we are continuing to raise money to get the facility done right, so that it is a safe and welcoming place for domestic violence victims to get the help they need. I truly appreciate their support with the Rose Andom Center and their commitment to domestic violence awareness and intervention."

The [Rose Andom Center](#) is being modeled after other Family Justice Centers successfully operating across the country and will create a "wrap-around" service delivery model to provide victims with one central location for coordinated services involving 25 distinct agencies, including resource providers from both community-based organizations and the civil and criminal legal systems.

The Center will focus on safety, confidentiality, counseling, children's services, legal assistance, shelter, job referrals, and medical care. The Center will serve an estimated 3,000 victims per year in a warm, welcoming facility that empowers victims to make the best decisions for their families.
