MAN SENTENCED IN COLD CASE SEX ASSAULT

A man who assaulted two young girls in 2006 has been sentenced to prison, following an arrest and prosecution that resulted from Katie's Law.

Nathaniel Malcolm (dob: 11-21-80) was convicted of one count of sexual assault on a child (F4) and although he was eligible for probation, he was sentenced to 4 years in prison.

In June 2006, Malcolm stalked two young girls who were walking to Washington Park. They were sisters, ages 14 and 10 at the time. It was the middle of the afternoon on a summer day, and he followed the girls for a number of blocks. Malcolm came up behind the older sister, and after exposing himself he pressed against her and ejaculated. He then walked away.

The young girls were able to provide some identifying information but police were not able to identify the perpetrator at the time. The case was unsolved until Malcolm was arrested on an unrelated felony in Eagle County in 2013 and his DNA, taken at the time of that arrest, was found to be a match to the DNA from the 2006 crime.

The case was prosecuted by Chief Deputy DA Dawn Weber as part of Denver's Cold Case Project.
