GUILTY PLEA IN PETITION FORGERY CASE

A woman accused of forging multiple names and signatures on election petitions in Arapahoe County, Jefferson County and Denver that were then submitted to the Colorado Secretary of State's Office, has pleaded guilty today.

Maureen Marie Moss (dob: 05-16-71) pleaded guilty to two counts of forgery (F5). She faces a sentence range of 2 to 6 years in prison when she appears for sentencing in Denver District Court on January 20, 2017.

In February and March 2016, Moss submitted numerous forged petition signatures to her employer, who in turn provided the petitions to a political campaign, who then submitted them to the Colorado Secretary of State. The case is the result of investigative work by the First, Second and Eighteenth Judicial District Attorney's Offices and was prosecuted by Denver Chief Deputy DA Joe Morales.
