WOMAN CHARGED WITH FORGING HER DIVORCE PAPERWORK

Denver District Attorney Mitch Morrissey has formally charged a Denver woman with multiple

felony counts; she is accused of forging her husband's name on divorce paperwork and filing the

petition and other documents in District Court.

**Xochitlt Ramirez** (dob: 04-28-81) is charged with two counts of attempt to influence a public

servant (F4), two counts of forgery (F5), and two counts of conspiracy (F5, F6).

The charges allege that in 2012, Ramirez filed a joint petition for the dissolution of marriage

without her husband's knowledge or consent, and that she forged his signature on the paperwork.

That petition was not granted, and the forgery was discovered a few months ago when

documents were being researched for a new petition filed in 2014.

A warrant has been issued for Ramirez's arrest. Anyone with information about Ramirez's
