ONE MAN CONVICTED, ONE ACQUITTED IN 2015 SLAYING OF YOUTH

A Denver District Court jury returned a guilty verdict yesterday against one man and acquitted another in the shooting death of a teenager in April 2015.

Kentrall Hines (dob: 8-11-96) was convicted after an 11-day trial of one count of *felony murder* (F1), one count of *attempt to commit aggravated robbery* (F4), and one count of *conspiracy to commit aggravated robbery* (F4) for the attempted robbery and shooting death of 19-year-old Randy Canister.

Hines was immediately sentenced to the Colorado Department of Corrections to life without parole on the murder conviction (the attempted robbery conviction was merged by the court with the felony murder conviction for sentencing purposes), and to 16 years in the Department of Corrections on the conspiracy to commit robbery conviction, both sentences to run concurrently. Hines was acquitted on one count of *murder in the first degree-after deliberation* (F1).

Co-defendant **Qashelby Frazier-Moore** (dob: 11-18-1994) was acquitted on all charged counts: one count of *felony murder* (F1), one count of *aggravated robbery* (F3) and one count of *conspiracy to commit aggravated robbery* (F4). A count of *murder in the first degree-after deliberation* (F1) was dismissed prior to jury deliberations.

On the evening of February 17, 2015, Frazier-Moore and Hines were in a car with the victim when the victim was shot and his body left on the side of the street at East Robins Drive and Ireland Street in what appeared to be a gang-related incident. The defendants allegedly planned to rob Mr. Canister, for which Hines was additionally convicted.
