I, Detective Brian Mudloff #06149, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above-named person(s), are the following:

On 04/12/2019 at Your Affiant, Detective Mudloff #06149 was contacted by Sergeant Troy Bisgard who advised that Aurora Police had just concluded an interview of a victim [REDACTED] that occurred in Denver at the 5110 N Hannibal St. Sergeant Bisgard reported that the incident was reported to Detective Steven Nelson #301017 of the Aurora Police Department.

Your Affiant contacted Detective Nelson who advised that on 04/12/2019 he conducted an interview with the victim, [REDACTED] in relation to an incident that occurred on 04/03/2019 at 10100 E 13th Ave in the City of Aurora, County of Arapahoe, State of Colorado. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] Tushar Rae (09/16/1988), [REDACTED]

Detective Nelson advised that [REDACTED] reported that on 04/03/2019 she received a text message from Rae with a photograph of a gun and a text saying that he was on his way to the school where they both work. Detective Nelson wrote in his affidavit for arrest from the incident that [REDACTED] was instructed by Rae to meet him in his office. Once in the office Tushar closed the door and pulled a

black handgun from his rear waistband and placed the gun on the counter between himself and [REDACTED]. Detective Nelson wrote that Rae stated, "Try and fuck with me. You shouldn't have said what you said. I don't want to hurt you, I'm going to hurt all the people around you." Detective Nelson reported that Rae said that he was going to shoot the knee caps off of two other school administrators. Detective Nelson reported that two students knocked on the door, Rae returned the gun to his waistband and [REDACTED] left the office and the school was placed on lock down.

Detective Nelson reported that when the school was placed on lock down, it prompted a large scale police call for service. Detective Nelson reported that Rae left the school and was later contacted by phone and reported that he was at his residence at 5110 N Hannibal St in Denver, CO. Officers responded to Rae's address where he was taken into custody without incident. Detective Nelson reported that Rae allowed Aurora police officers access to his house and directed them to where his gun was. Officers recovered a Remington handgun and three magazines from Rae's bedroom closet.

Detective Nelson reported that Rae was placed into custody for Felony Menacing and Interference with and Educational Institution and subsequently bonded out. Once out of custody, Detective Nelson filed additional charges of Unlawfully carrying a firearm on school grounds and unlawful conceal carry. Detective Nelson reported that the courts set a \$200,000 bond for Rae who then bonded out on a surety bond.

Detective Nelson reported that during his interview with [REDACTED] he asked if there had ever been any threats with guns or gun violence directed towards her from Rae. Detective Nelson advised that [REDACTED] advised of an incident that occurred on March 1, 2019 at Rae's residence at 5110 N Hannibal St. [REDACTED] told Detective Nelson that they had been out for a work function at an escape room somewhere in Denver. After the escape room, they went to a bar and Rae shared Marijuana edibles with another co-worker. [REDACTED] told Detective Nelson that she and Rae returned to his residence at 5110 N Hannibal St.

Detective Nelson reported that Rae became depressed and was feeling sad for himself when [REDACTED] wanted to leave. [REDACTED] told Detective Nelson that Rae retrieved a black semi-automatic handgun from a green Remington case. [REDACTED] reported to Detective Nelson that she watched as Rae loaded gold colored bullets into the magazine, put the magazine in the handle of the gun and racked the slide. [REDACTED] then reported to Detective Nelson that Rae pointed the gun at her, "center mass," [REDACTED] demonstrated to Detective Nelson by patting her chest. Detective Nelson advised that this caused [REDACTED] to fear for her safety and her life. [REDACTED] then told Detective Nelson that Rae moved the gun just to the side of her and fired a single round. [REDACTED] told Detective Nelson that this was the first time that she had heard or seen a gun go off. [REDACTED] then fled the location and did not report the incident because she didn't want Rae to get in trouble because [REDACTED] and that she didn't want Rae to commit suicide. [REDACTED] told Detective Nelson that Rae had previously told her that he would commit suicide and it would be [REDACTED] fault.

Detective Nelson confirmed with [REDACTED] that the firearm that was used at the school on April 3, 2019 was the same firearm that was used on March 1, 2019 and that it is in Aurora Police Custody.

██████████ then reported to Detective Nelson that on March 7, 2019 she was on her way to another work function when she stopped at Rae's residence at 5110 N Hannibal St. ██████████ told Detective Nelson that Rae was feeling sorry for himself and was depressed. ██████████ told Rae that she had to leave to go to the school function. ██████████ told Detective Nelson that Rae told her not to leave and she offered to allow him to come with. Rae declined and ██████████ reported that she attempted to leave. ██████████ told Detective Nelson that she went to the front door when Rae blocked her exit. ██████████ then advised Detective Nelson that she attempted to go to the garage door to make her exit, but Rae grabbed her by the arm and threw her down on the couch. ██████████ reported to Detective Nelson that an argument ensued until she called 911. Denver Police Officers responded, and Rae allowed ██████████ to leave at that time. Officers reported that there was a verbal argument and advised both parties at the time.

Your Affiant was advised of the above events by Detective Nelson of the Aurora Police Department after he conducted a video recorded interview with the victim. Detective Mudloff was advised by Detective Nelson that Rae is no longer in custody and it is unknown if he has access to additional firearms.

Based on the aforementioned information, your Affiant respectfully requests that a probable cause arrest warrant be approved for the suspect, Tushar Aftab Rae (09/16/1988) for the charges of Felony Menacing, C.R.S. §18-3-206(1)(a)(b) and False Imprisonment, C.R.S. §18-8-111, so that the investigation may continue.
