Probable Cause: Your Affiant learned the following from the Dispatch Incident Detail Report. On May 31, 2019 at 1:01 p.m. the Denver Combined Communications Center received a 911 call reporting a party not breathing at 1228 E. 22 nd Ave.											
Your Affiant reviewed the 911 call and learned that the suspect, Erik MAW dob: 01/26/1970, called the victim's family. The victim's family called 911 and reported that the victim was not breathing. They gave the address of the emergency but did not know any other information.											
Your Affiant learned the following from Corporal Ernest QUINTANA 01052. Officers responded to cover and assist the ambulance on a medical call. Upon arrival, paramedics related female victim had visible signs of trauma and was deceased. The male related to paramedics Corporal QUINTANA observed the deceased female victim in kitchen/living room area. Corporal Quintana contacted the male, MAW, and asked what was going on. The male related that he and the victim got into a fight and he fell asleep. When he woke up, the victim was deceased.											
The victim, dob: dob: // 1975, was pronounced deceased on May 31, 2019, at 1:07 p.m. by Denver Health Medical Center Paramedic BRUSKE through Denver Health Medical Center Doctor MCVANEY.											

Your Affiant searched Denver Records and located a previously documented contact on May 1, 2019 which was a dispatched as a domestic violence call. Neighbors called to report that the victim and suspect were yelling and fighting. Officers responded and learned that there were no law violations.

The suspect was transported to Denver Police Headquarters for an interview. The suspect was read his Miranda Advisement and agreed to voluntarily speak with Detective Louis ESTRADA 96050. The suspect related that he and the victim bought vodka and returned to their apartment. They began drinking and one of them blew up, but he was not sure if it was him or the victim. They engaged in a fight and then he went to sleep. He woke up to find her deceased. He saw that both of her eyes were black and she had blood on her nose. When asked how she obtained the injuries, he related that he must have caused them because they were the only two in the house. When asked, the suspect text messaged back and forth and the top of his right foot. He had several other small injuries on his forearms and chest, and what he described as a bite injury on his left thumb. When asked what he was wearing on the night of the fight, the suspect related that he was wearing the shirt that he was currently wearing during the interview and blue jeans that he changed out of. The suspect further related that his cell phone is a ZTE and was still in the house. He also related that the victim's cell phone was in the house under her body.

A search warrant was drafted, approved and executed on the scene of the crime, 1228 E. 22nd Ave.

Your Affiant learned the following from Detective Bruce GIBBS 95047. The victim sustained injuries described as abrasions on her knees, apparent facial trauma including bruising and blood, and possible ligature marks on her neck. These injuries were observed without moving the victim because the scene was being processed and at the time this probable cause statement was authored.
