

**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT AND TO SEAL THE
AFFIDAVIT FOR THE PERSON OF:**

Black male, 6 feet, 150 pounds, brown eyes, black hair

**C.R.S. 18-3-102, Murder in the First Degree a class 1 felony and
C.R.S. 18-3-102 (b) Felony Murder a class 1 felony**

I, Detective Michael MARTINEZ, 82029, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above named person(s), are the following:

Your affiant presents the following facts in establishing probable cause for the arrest of the suspect, Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000, for the listed offenses.

Your Affiant, Detective Michael MARTINEZ, 82029, a member of the Denver Police Department, currently assigned to the Homicide Unit, provides the following facts in support of the motion for non-testimonial identification in the above-captioned matter:

On Sunday morning, August 20th, 2017, at approximately 12:18 am, Denver 911 received calls of a shooting in the area of Titan Court and Tucson Way, in Denver. Officers arrived on the scene and found a male, later identified as Joshua HUGHES 11/17/1990, lying in the street with multiple gunshot wounds. Ambulance #76, with Paramedic Donald O'MEARA, responded to the scene and transported Joshua HUGHES to Denver Health Medical Center.

Due to the extent of Mr. HUGHES injuries, Detectives Michael MARTINEZ, 82029 and Daniel TREGEMBO, 05041, were called out and asked to respond to Denver Police Department Headquarters to begin interviewing witnesses.

Your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO obtained from neighborhood witnesses; [REDACTED] [REDACTED]/1978, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]/1988, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]/1978, and [REDACTED] [REDACTED]/1984, living at different addresses, that they had heard multiple shots and went outside to find the victim lying in the street with multiple gunshot wounds. [REDACTED] related she had surveillance cameras around her residence. Ms. [REDACTED] related she and her husband, [REDACTED], got home minutes before the shooting. Ms. [REDACTED] related a white male had come up to her husband and asked him about an address. Ms. [REDACTED] related she and her husband were inside the house when they heard shots. Ms. [REDACTED] related detectives had her permission to download the video.

While at headquarters, Detective TREGEMBO had obtained information from Detective Roger TORGESON, 07074, who was at the scene; that a white van with Montana license plate [REDACTED], was parked at the scene and maybe associated with the victim. Detective TREGEMBO drafted a Search Warrant for this van, while your Affiant was still interviewing witnesses. The van with Montana license plate [REDACTED], listed to a white, 2008, Chevrolet Express G2500 van, and the registered

owner as [REDACTED], at W. Wabasha, in Baker, Montana. The Search Warrant was signed by the Honorable Judge Clarisse GONZALES.

After the witnesses were interviewed, your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO responded to the scene with a Search Warrant on the white van with Montana license plate [REDACTED]

Your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO learned that victim, Joshua HUGHES had been pronounced dead at approximately 3:31 am, by Dr. WHITE, from Denver Health Medical Center.

After arriving at the crime scene, the crime scene was found to be in the residential area of Titan Court and Tucson Way in Montebello. Denver Police Officers had secured the area with yellow and red crime scene tape and with marked patrol cars. Your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO contacted Detective TORGESON, who had originally responded to the scene. Detective TORGESON pointed out spent shell casings in the street, that were in front of and behind the van. Detective TORGESON also pointed out possible bullets strikes to nearby houses. Parked along the curb was a white van with Montana license plate [REDACTED]. There was a pool of blood in the street just a few feet from the opened driver's door of the van. Among the spent shell casings in front of the van, was 1 live round. This live round was later collected and found to be a live Winchester 9mm luger round.

Denver Crime Lab Imaging Personnel Mike BUSH, B06068, had been asked to respond to the scene to download the video from [REDACTED] Tucson Way. Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] had given detectives permission earlier to download the video. When the video was reviewed, it showed a male approaching Mr. [REDACTED] and then walking away. The video then showed a total of 4 people on the corner. The 4 were later identified as Joshua [REDACTED], [REDACTED] [REDACTED] /1975, and the 2 suspects. As the video continued, it showed all 4 parties walking out of view of the camera. The video then showed Joshua HUGHES being walked back to the direction of where his van was parked, with a suspect (suspect 1) right on him. After Joshua HUGHES and suspect 1 walk out of view, the second suspect (suspect 2) walked into view and was seen walking in the direction of where HUGHES and suspect 1 had walked out of view. Suspect 2 can be seen raising an arm and pointing what appears to be a handgun before walking out of view. The video did not capture the victim's van or the shooting of the victim.

During the search of the white van with Montana license plate [REDACTED], a Samsung Galaxy tablet and paperwork with names and motels were found inside. One recent motel receipt was from the EconoLodge at 12101 Grant Street, in Thornton, CO.

Sergeants Thomas Rowe, 95096 and Joseph ENGELBERT, 01053, who had been at the scene, responded to the EconoLodge to meet with Thornton Police. A [REDACTED] was contacted at the EconoLodge in a room registered to Joshua HUGHES. Ms. [REDACTED] was brought to Denver Police Department Headquarters and interviewed by your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO. Ms. [REDACTED] had no information on what had just happened to Joshua HUGHES. Ms. [REDACTED] related Joshua had been with an [REDACTED] earlier. Your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO gave Ms. [REDACTED] a ride back to the EconoLodge.

After arriving at the EconoLodge, Ms. [REDACTED] related she had some belongings at a residence in Northglenn. Ms. [REDACTED] believed [REDACTED] would be at that residence. Ms. [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] by phone and asked [REDACTED] to bring her belongings to the motel for her. When [REDACTED] arrived at the motel and was immediately contacted by your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO. [REDACTED] was identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] /1975. [REDACTED] at first denied being with Joshua HUGHES, ^{THOU} [REDACTED] admitted he had been

Joshua during this incident. Mr. [REDACTED] was taken to Denver Police Department Headquarters and interviewed.

At approximately 6:15 pm, [REDACTED] was interviewed at Denver Police Headquarters by your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO. Mr. [REDACTED] related that Joshua HUGHES came to Denver with the intention of purchasing marijuana and taking it back to Montana. Mr. [REDACTED] related Joshua wanted to buy 2 pounds of marijuana with the \$3,000.00 he had collected from co-workers back in Montana. Mr. [REDACTED] related their friend, [REDACTED] was a member of a website called Commerce City Kush Club, a website where marijuana could be bought and sold. Mr. [REDACTED] related [REDACTED] posted on the website, 2P for 3K for Joshua HUGHES. Mr. [REDACTED] related on Saturday night (August 19th) someone with a Facebook user name of "Marcus BILES", answered the ad and wanted to make the deal. Mr. [REDACTED] contacted Joshua with this information and Joshua agreed to make the deal. Mr. [REDACTED] related he agreed to go with Joshua. Mr. [REDACTED] related it was just before midnight when Joshua picked him up. Mr. [REDACTED] related they communicated back and forth with the seller "Marcus BILES", via Facebook messenger. Mr. [REDACTED] related he had [REDACTED]'s Samsung Galaxy tablet with him. Mr. [REDACTED] related they were given the address of [REDACTED] Titan Court. Mr. [REDACTED] related when they arrived at the location they did not find an address of [REDACTED] Titan Court and ended up parking in front of [REDACTED] Titan Court. Mr. [REDACTED] related they were in Joshua's white company van. Mr. [REDACTED] related they continued communicating with "Marcus BILES" via Facebook messenger. Mr. [REDACTED] related it did not take long when 2 Black males approached them on foot from the south. Mr. [REDACTED] asked the 2 Black males if they wanted to get into the van. Mr. [REDACTED] related they did not want to get into the van, so the 4 of them walked northbound on Titan Court and got away from the street light. Mr. [REDACTED] related after they stopped by some vehicles parked along the street. Mr. [REDACTED] related one of the males produced a handgun and pointed the gun at Joshua's head. Mr. [REDACTED] related the other male appeared to be pulling out a handgun, at which time Mr. [REDACTED] claimed he attempted to punch the male and then took off running through the houses. Mr. [REDACTED] claimed as he was running away, he heard one of the male's yell at Joshua something like, "Where's the money". Mr. [REDACTED] related as he was hiding in a backyard, he heard gunshots. Mr. [REDACTED] related he again took off running. Mr. [REDACTED] attempted to stop a vehicle, but the vehicle would not stop. Mr. [REDACTED] claimed he ended up walking all the way back to Thornton. Mr. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] what had happened. Mr. [REDACTED] had related they had been by some vehicles parked along the street when this all went down.

Your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO gave Mr. [REDACTED] a ride back to where he was staying, [REDACTED] Humboldt St., in Northglenn. At the residence was [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] confirmed he helped Joshua HUGHES with a marijuana purchase through a Facebook user group, Commerce City Kush Club. Mr. [REDACTED] related he used his Samsung Galaxy tablet to post a message that he was looking for 2 pounds of marijuana in exchange for 3 thousand dollars. Mr. [REDACTED] reported he received some offers, including the response from a male on August 20th, 2017, at approximately 10:30 pm. Mr. [REDACTED] related he fell asleep and [REDACTED] ended up taking his Samsung Galaxy tablet to make the deal for the marijuana. Mr. [REDACTED] gave consent to the detectives to review his Samsung Galaxy tablet, which included the messages exchanged about the marijuana deal. A review of the Facebook messages identified a Facebook user under the name "Marcus Biles", which showed messages being exchanged up to the time of the shooting.

Detective TORGESON, who had returned to work for his shift, was asked if he could return to the scene and check the vehicles parked along the south side of the 5000 block of Titan Court and just west of Tucson Way, for any type of disturbance along the sidewalk side of the vehicles.

Detective TORGESON later related that 3 swabs were taken by the Denver Crime Lab from a 2014, white Dodge Ram truck with Colorado plate [REDACTED], which was parked in this area. Detective TORGESON reported 3 swabs were taken from the rear passenger side door, where there appeared to be swipes on the door. It was reported a total of 3 swabs were taken; marker A – rear passenger door; marker B – rear passenger door; and marker C – rear passenger door, just above the door handle. These swabs were placed into the Denver Property Bureau under invoice 907208.

On August 21st, 2017, Detective TREGEMBO began searching Facebook for the name "Marcus Biles". No account was located under "Marcus Biles", but an account under the profile name "Biles Marcus" was located. Detective TREGEMBO related the profile picture with the Facebook name for "Biles Marcus" was consistent with the profile picture for Facebook name "Marcus Biles", which was observed on the message stream from [REDACTED]'s Samsung Galaxy tablet with "Marcus Biles".

On August 23rd, 2017, your Affiant submitted a Lab Request to have the live Winchester 9mm Luger round and the 3 swabs taken from the parked vehicles, analyzed for possible DNA.

On August 29th, 2017, Detective TREGEMBO obtained a Search Warrant for Facebook Inc. to identify the Facebook user "Biles Marcus". It was also requested that all communication of Facebook user "Biles Marcus" from January 1st, 2017 thru August 29th, 2017.

During the course of this investigation, your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO solicited the help of Denver Police Department Vice/Narcotics Unit. Detective Matthew CONLEY, 14054, who was assigned to the Vice/Narcotics Unit, was able to monitor the Commerce City Kush Club with the help of [REDACTED]. Detective CONLEY was looking for "Marcus Biles" to post on the website.

On September 7th, 2017, Detective CONLEY notified Detective TREGEMBO that he found a posted message from September 6th, 2017, in which Facebook user "[REDACTED]" had solicited that he wanted to purchase marijuana. Detective CONLEY related Facebook user "Marcus Biles" responded to the post and offered to sell the marijuana to "[REDACTED]". Denver Police Department Crime Analyst Chris GRAY was given the Facebook profile "[REDACTED]" and asked if he could identify "[REDACTED]". Crime Analyst GRAY identified "[REDACTED]" as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] /1997.

Your Affiant and Detectives TREGEMBO and CONLEY began searching for [REDACTED] [REDACTED] /1997. [REDACTED] was found at an address in Commerce City. [REDACTED] confirmed he had solicited on Facebook user group Commerce City Kush Club that he wanted to purchase marijuana. [REDACTED] confirmed he had communicated with Facebook user name "Marcus Biles". [REDACTED] related he had planned to meet with "Marcus Biles", but got nervous and did not meet. [REDACTED] related "Marcus Biles" had wanted to meet in Montebello. [REDACTED] agreed to allow Detective CONLEY to take control of his Facebook account "[REDACTED]" in order to re-initiate contact with Facebook user "Marcus Biles".

Detective CONLEY, utilizing the Facebook account "[REDACTED]", was able to make contact with "Marcus Biles". Detective CONLEY was able to obtain a telephone number from "Marcus Biles". Detective CONLEY obtained phone number, 720-[REDACTED]. Through a public records search, this number listed to [REDACTED] through new Cingular Wireless PCS, AT&T Wireless.

Denver Vice/Narcotics Detective Jon CROWE, 04091, utilized an online open source records search and identified phone number 720-[REDACTED] as being associated with Facebook profile "Armani PIERRE". Detectives CROWE and CONLEY reviewed "Armani PIERRE's" Facebook page and identified "Pierre" to be friends with the "Biles Marcus" Facebook account. Detectives CROWE and CONLEY

related they reviewed pictures on the "Armani PIERRE" and "Biles Marcus" Facebook accounts and found pictures of a young Black male in a South High School shirt. Another picture showed a South High School student ID with the name Armani PIERRE with a photo.

Detective CONLEY contacted Denver Police Department School Resource Officer Ryan BARNES, 00111. Officer BARNES was provided a picture from the "Armani Pierre" Facebook page. Officer BARNES identified the male in the picture as Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, a former student at South High School. Officer BARNES remembered Armani PIERRE being associated with a theft of motor vehicle case at South High School ([REDACTED]).

A review of Internal Denver Police Department records identified Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, living at 4764 Blackhawk Way, in Denver. Colorado Department of Motor Vehicle also listed Armani PIERRE's address as 4764 Blackhawk Way.

Detectives CONLEY and CROWE reported they found a picture on the Armani Pierre Facebook page which showed Armani next to a white vehicle. The picture only showed half of the Colorado license plate with the license plate ending with "[REDACTED]". Detectives CONLEY and CROWE requested a listing of vehicles with the partial plate and identified a vehicle with Colorado license plate [REDACTED] on a 2007 white Hyundai, listed to [REDACTED] at 4764 Blackhawk Way, in Denver. [REDACTED] was the name also listing to phone number 720-[REDACTED] a phone number Detective CONLEY had obtained from the Facebook user name of "Marcus Biles".

A review of Internal Denver Police Department Records found a [REDACTED], in which Armani PIERRE was listed as [REDACTED] Armani PIERRE. The address of offense was listed as 4764 Blackhawk Way, in Denver.

On September 10th, 2017, Detective TREGEMBO was able to talk to [REDACTED] by phone. Mr. [REDACTED] related he was in Oklahoma. Mr. [REDACTED] was told that detectives wanted him to view a photo array. Detective TREGEMBO made arrangements for Mr. [REDACTED] to meet with an Investigator in Oklahoma to look at a photo array. Detective TREGEMBO made arrangements for Mr. [REDACTED] to meet with Detective Gillian O'BRIEN with the Chickasha Police Department in Oklahoma.

On September 11th, 2017, Mr. [REDACTED] met with Chickasha, Oklahoma Police Detective Gillian O'BRIEN to view a photo array. Mr. [REDACTED] responded to 2001 W. Iowa Ave., in Chickasha, Oklahoma. The array, which was put together by your Affiant had been scanned and sent to Detective O'BRIEN, included a booking photo of Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, in photo #5. Detective O'BRIEN reported back to Detective TREGEMBO that Mr. [REDACTED] had identified photo #1 as being involved with the homicide death of Joshua HUGHES. The person shown in photo #1, was a filler.

On September 21st, 2017, Forensic Scientists Andrew CARMEL and Eric DUVALL completed a DNA Unit Laboratory Report. According to the report, a partial DNA profile was obtained from the live Winchester 9mm Luger cartridge (Item 907044-3) found at the scene. According to the report there was at least 1 male contributor and it was estimated to 70 times more likely if the sample originated from Joshua Hughes than from one unknown person. This DNA profile was not illegible for CODIS. It was also reported a partial DNA profile was obtained from the swab from marker C (Item 907208-3C), which was collected at the scene. According to the report there was a mixture of at least 2 people (at least 1 male), and that Joshua HUGHES was excluded. It was reported this partial DNA profile was submitted to CODIS, but as of October 2nd, 2017, no match had been reported.

On September 26th, 2017, Detective TREGEMBO received the requested information back from Facebook on the "Biles Marcus" account after obtaining a search warrant. Included in this information were messages from Facebook user [REDACTED] to "Biles Marcus" dated August 20th, 2017, at 03:10:54 UTC (which converts to August 19th, 2017, at 9:10:54 p.m. MST). Messages confirm that Facebook user [REDACTED] posted a message about wanting to purchase two pounds of marijuana, which was consistent with the information obtained from [REDACTED]. Facebook records also confirmed the "Biles Marcus" account was used as a means of communication with Joshua HUGHES and [REDACTED] to meet to purchase the marijuana, which ended up with the homicide death of Joshua HUGHES.

On September 28th, 2017, while reviewing Officer's Statements, your Affiant found that Officer Patrick SMITH, 16035, reported that ambulance #76, responded to the scene with Paramedic MEARA (should be Paramedic Daniel O'MEARA). Officer SMITH reported Paramedic MEARA reported the victim stated to him, "I was robbed".

On September 29th, 2017, your Affiant contacted Denver Paramedic Donald O'MEARA by phone. Your Affiant wanted to confirm that victim, Joshua HUGHES, had told him that he had been robbed, when according to his written statement the only statement made by Joshua HUGHES to him was his name, "Josh". Paramedic O'MEARA related he remembers someone saying that the victim stated he had been robbed, but Paramedic O'MEARA did not remember who had stated it, whether it was an officer or fire personnel, but he did not think he heard it from the victim.

Your Affiant reviewed the Incident Detail Report for incident DPD-17-0554409, for 08/20/2017, and found an entry at 00:34:35, where it was reported that the victim stated he was robbed.

On October 2nd, 2017, at approximately 12:15 pm, your Affiant obtained a Rule 41.1 for Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999. The Rule 41.1 was signed by the Honorable Judge Johnny BARAJAS.

At approximately 3:00 pm, Armani PIERRE was brought to Denver Police Department Headquarters to execute the Rule 41.1 and obtain a saliva sample from Armani PIERRE.

On Wednesday, November 8th, 2017, your Affiant received via email, a notification from Andrew CARMEL a Forensic Scientist with the Denver Crime Lab that a Crime Lab Report had just been completed and was attached to case 2017-554409. Your Affiant viewed the attached Crime Lab Report which was a completed report from Denver Forensic Scientists Andrew CARMEL and Eric DUVALL. In the report it was reported that Armani PIERRE was excluded as a contributor to the DNA profiles obtained from the scene swabs and the live cartridge.

During the course of the investigation, Detective TREGEMBO had obtained Search Warrants for Facebook names and cell phone numbers. Detective TREGEMBO related to your Affiant that Armani PIERRE and Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000 were Facebook friends and were in constant contact with each other. It was also discovered that Quincy WILKERSON and Armani PIERRE had been named as being involved in a robbery together, case 2017-474529, in which a sale was set up via Facebook. Arrangements had been made to meet in Montebello. The victim in this case refused to press charges.

Detective TREGEMBO through Facebook, identified [REDACTED] /2000, as Quincy WILKERSON's [REDACTED]

On Friday morning, November 10th, 2017, at approximately 10:00 am, your Affiant and Detective Tregembo, interviewed ██████████ ██████████/█████████/2000. This interview took place at ██████████ ██████████ at ██████████ in Denver. This interview took place in the office of the dean.

██████████ confirmed she was ██████████ Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000. ██████████ related they had ██████████ for about a year and a half. ██████████ related about 2 to 3 months ago, she asked Quincy to stop hanging around his cousin, Armani. ██████████ related Armani would ask Quincy to do "bad things". When asked what kind of "bad things", ██████████ claimed Armani was into robberies. ██████████ admitted that back in August or September, Quincy had called her and told her that Armani had set up a "lick" (robbery) and it got out of control. ██████████ believed Quincy had called her a couple of hours after the incident. ██████████ related that Quincy told her that there had been a shooting and someone died. ██████████ related that Quincy told her that it all happened so fast. ██████████ knew it had something to do with money and knew that it happened in Montebello. ██████████ related she could hear in Quincy's voice that he was shaken up.

Joshua HUGHES was shot and killed on Sunday, August 20th, 2017, in the 5000 block of Titan Court, in the Montebello neighborhood in Denver. Joshua HUGHES had agreed to meet the suspect to purchase marijuana.

On Wednesday, November 15th, 2017, your Affiant obtained a Rule 41.1, to obtain saliva samples from Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000, for the purpose of obtaining a DNA profile that could then be compared to the partial DNA profiles obtained from the scene.

On Thursday, November 16th, 2017, at approximately 9:25 am, your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO contacted Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000, at his home address of 5010 Titan Court, in Denver and executed the Rule 41.1, to obtain a saliva sample.

On Wednesday, January 3rd, 2018, your Affiant was informed by Detective TREGEMBO that he had just received information that Quincy WILKERSON 01/03/2000, had fled the state of Colorado shortly after providing a saliva sample and was possibly in either North Carolina or South Carolina.

Detective TREGEMBO related that Denver Police Corporal Brian McNEILL, 07012, was clerking at the District 2 station when he received a phone call from a ██████████ ██████████/1953. Mr. ██████████ related he had information regarding a homicide that occurred on Titan Court. Mr. ██████████ wanted to speak with School Resource Officer ██████████ ██████████ with whom Mr. ██████████ had previous contacts with. Corporal McNEILL told Mr. ██████████ that Officer JONES was unavailable. Corporal McNEILL related that Mr. ██████████ related ██████████ ██████████ had told him that he was hanging out at Quincy WILKERSON's residence, when he heard gunshots after Quincy had left the house. ██████████ related that the police had collected DNA from Quincy and since that time, Quincy moved to South Carolina. Mr. ██████████ related that ██████████ had called him from the bus depot, saying he was going to meet Quincy in South Carolina.

On Wednesday, January 10th, 2018, at approximately 10:33 am, your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO contacted ██████████ at ██████████ ██████████, in Denver. Mr. ██████████ confirmed ██████████ ██████████, talked about a shooting near his friend "Quincy's" house in Montebello. Mr. ██████████ called ██████████ and allowed your Affiant to speak with ██████████ and arrange to meet him at his school, at 546 N. Mariposa Street.

At approximately 12:08 pm, [REDACTED] was interviewed at Denver Police Department Headquarters after being picked up from his school. [REDACTED] related that he knew the detectives want to talk him about Quincy, because he did something stupid. [REDACTED] stated, Quincy was "involved in a shooting, right". [REDACTED] related [REDACTED] told him that Quincy did something stupid and the police would be reaching out to him since he was at Quincy's house (5010 Titan Way). [REDACTED] related he and [REDACTED] were in the basement of Quincy's house watching Netflix, when Quincy left the house saying "he had to go take care of some business". [REDACTED] related they heard gunshots and someone laid dead in front of the house. [REDACTED] related Quincy came back to the house after about an hour after the gunshots. [REDACTED] related they asked Quincy where he had been and Quincy related he had to take care of some business on the east side. [REDACTED] related they told Quincy they heard gun shots and asked what happened. [REDACTED] related Quincy claimed he did not know what happened, but claimed you could tell "something happened". [REDACTED] related Quincy was shaking and looking around.

[REDACTED] related Quincy was wearing a black hoodie and blue jeans. [REDACTED] remembered the hoodie because [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related Quincy has since taken the hoodie back. [REDACTED] related that Quincy took all his stuff and moved out of Montbello after the police collected his DNA. [REDACTED] related Quincy told him that he was moving to "Carolina", where he has a cousin [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related that about 2 months ago, Quincy told him that he was going to move. [REDACTED] claimed Quincy had saved up \$180 for a bus ticket. [REDACTED] claimed that Quincy called from an unknown number to say he was leaving.

[REDACTED] claimed he heard that Quincy got a gun from "Vito" (Kylvito GARRETTE), but never actually saw Quincy with a gun.

[REDACTED] claimed [REDACTED] called him to say "Quincy did something stupid". They did not know whether it was Quincy or Vito that shot. [REDACTED] claimed [REDACTED] said Quincy or Vito "caught a body" and that someone died. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if he remembered (that night). [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] the police would be calling him about Quincy.

[REDACTED] related Quincy's [REDACTED] is [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related [REDACTED] and Quincy were talking about police tapping phones and such. [REDACTED] related Quincy started saving money to leave town. [REDACTED] claimed Quincy and [REDACTED] are close and Quincy tells [REDACTED] everything.

On Thursday, January 11th, 2018, at approximately 6:13 pm, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]/[REDACTED]/2000 was interviewed at Denver Police Department Headquarters by your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO.

[REDACTED] re-iterated the same information she had provided on November 10th, 2017, when she was interviewed at her school by your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO. [REDACTED] related she wants to go to school for criminal justice. [REDACTED] related she was recently accepted into three colleges. [REDACTED] related shortly after interviewing her at her school, she [REDACTED] Quincy WILKERSON. [REDACTED] related she was scared for Quincy and believed he would talk to the detectives. [REDACTED] thinks Quincy left the state because he knows what he did was wrong. [REDACTED] related Quincy told her this happened around his house. [REDACTED] did not think Quincy got anything from the victim. [REDACTED] related that she knows Armani set it up, but did not know if Armani was there. Quincy told [REDACTED] that Armani set up the robbery through Facebook. [REDACTED] related that she knew Quincy was doing robberies with Armani before this incident.

On Wednesday, February 14th, 2018, your Affiant was informed Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, had been arrested for having a gun at his school. Armani PIERRE was brought to Denver Police Department Headquarters for interviews.

On Wednesday, February 14th, 2018, at approximately 1:57 pm, your Affiant interviewed Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, at Denver Police Headquarters. Armani was advised of his rights and agreed to talk.

Armani admitted he had set up this marijuana deal under the name Biles Marcus with the Commerce City Kush Club. Armani admitted he only set up the deal and that Kyvito GARRETTE and Quincy WILKERSON carried it out. Armani admitted that Kyvito and Quincy later told him that the deal went bad, that the victim tried to rob them and that both of them (Kyvito and Quincy) shot the victim in self defense. Armani admitted he was supposed to get either 100 or 200 dollars for setting up the deal. Armani claimed he was on crutches during this time and was not there when the deal went down. Armani claimed he later learned the victim had died.

On Friday, February 16th, 2018, at approximately 9:45 am, your Affiant and Detective TREGEMBO interviewed [redacted] [redacted] / [redacted] / 2001, at [redacted] at [redacted] in Montbello. [redacted] confirmed she was [redacted] of Quincy WILKERSON. [redacted] recalled coming home from school and was told that the police had taken a DNA sample from [redacted] Quincy. [redacted] identified a single photo of Armani PIERRE 03/22/1999, and related Armani was [redacted]. [redacted] identified a single photo of Kyvito GARRETTE 11/10/1998, and related that Kyvito [redacted] related Kyvito and Quincy know each other. [redacted] claimed she was not at home during this homicide in question. [redacted] claimed [redacted] house, across from the school. [redacted] claimed when she got home, she heard there was a shooting in front of their house. [redacted] claimed Quincy never told her that he was involved. [redacted] related she learned that the police had collected Quincy's DNA. [redacted] claimed she last spoke to Quincy "months ago". [redacted] claimed she [redacted] one day and Quincy was not there. [redacted] claimed she did not know where Quincy had gone to.

Based on these facts, your Affiant is respectfully requesting an ARREST WARRANT and to SEAL the AFFIDAVIT pursuant to Rule 41 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, to have this Affidavit sealed from public release of the information herein contained, due to the media coverage of this case to assure that this case is not compromised and that the witnesses mentioned in this warrant can be protected from any type of early reprisals; for arrest of QUINCY WILKERSON 01/03/2000, for the offense(s) of C.R.S. 18-3-102, Murder in the First Degree a class 1 felony and C.R.S. 18-3-102 (b) Felony Murder a class 1 felony, so that this investigation can continue.
