I, Detective Danny Perez 95032, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above-named person(s), are the following:

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION:

On June 18, 2020, at approximately 1945 hours, Officers from the Denver Police Department responded to the 1500 block of Valentia Street on a report of a shooting. This location is now and was at the time of the incident located within the City and County of Denver. Upon arrival, Officers discovered the shooting victim, identified as Asian Sebastian Fair (040571), suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. The victim was immediately transported to Denver Health Medical Center for medical treatment, while on scene Officers secured the crime scene and began to conduct witness interviews.

During the witness interviews, Officers learned that the victim had been standing near a food truck which was parked on the northwest corner of Colfax Avenue and Valentia Street, and was in the company of several additional individuals. The suspect was then observed walking southbound along the west curb line in the 1500 block of Valentia Street directly towards the location where the victim was standing. Witnesses described the suspect as an African American male, approximately 5'8", stocky, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black shorts. The suspect then produced a handgun from his waistband area and immediately began to discharge rounds directly towards the victim. Following the gunshots being fired, the suspect fled the scene westbound through 1525 Valentia Street and then northbound in the 1500 block alley of Unita Street/Valentia Street.

Officers conducting a Neighborhood Survey, located surveillance video depicting the shooting incident recorded from a camera located at 1525 Valentia Street. Officers reviewed the archived video and documented that the images captured on the video were consistent with the eye witness accounts.

While processing the crime scene, Officer Clyde Carmody 14064 was approached by a female who wished to remain anonymous but provide information related to the shooting incident and the suspect. The female informed Officer Carmody that the shooting suspect was known by the moniker "Money GD" and described him as an African American male, 5'-8", bald, always dressed in black clothing and a black bandanna face mask. The female related that the shooting victim, Asian Fair (040571), was known by the moniker "Big Ace" and that his son is known by the moniker "Lil Ace". The female continued that the shooting suspect, "Money GD", was under the impression that the victim's son, "Lil Ace", was responsible for a shooting incident that had occurred on Hanover Street, in Aurora, Colorado. The female stated that based on this belief, "Money GD", had shot the victim. The female related that she did not know "Money GD's" true name but had been [REDACTED]. The female then identified "Money GD's" telephone number as 720-[REDACTED] and added that "Money GD's" girlfriend was an individual named [REDACTED]. The female also provided Officer Carmody with her telephone number but refused to provide a formal statement.

The crime scene was processed by personnel assigned to the Denver Police Department Crime Laboratory and consisted of six spent 9MM shell casings and suspected blood. Crime Laboratory personnel also documented that the food truck, which the victim had been standing near at the time of the incident, had also been struck by a fired bullet. The truck had been occupied during the shooting incident and vehicle occupant was identified as [REDACTED].

It should be noted that the victim, Asian Fair (040571), was unable to be interviewed reference this incident due to him being immediately taken into surgery upon arrival at Denver Health Medical Center.

Officer Christopher Gergits 16032 completed a General Offense Report which was assigned DPD case number 2020-372235.

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION:

On June 19, 2020, your affiant was assigned DPD case number 2020-372235 for follow-up investigation.

Your affiant reviewed all submitted reports and documents, to include a Serious Bodily Injury Report completed by Denver Health Medical Center Physician David Richards. The completed report indicated that victim, Asian Fair (040571), had indeed suffered serious bodily injury as a direct result of being assaulted by the at the time unidentified suspect.

On June 19, 2020, your affiant electronically submitted a request to the Denver Police Department Crime Laboratory Forensic Imaging Unit asking that personnel respond to 1525 Valentia Street, and 8275 E. Colfax Avenue, to retrieve a copy of the surveillance video footage recorded by cameras at both locations.

On June 22, 2020, your affiant received a disc from the Denver Police Department Crime Laboratory Forensic Imaging Unit which contained the requested surveillance video footage from the cameras located at 1525 Valentia Street and 8275 E. Colfax Avenue.

At 1105 hours, your affiant conducted a review of the video footage recorded from the multiple cameras at 8275 E. Colfax Avenue. Your affiant noted that a camera labeled as "Channel Four" was oriented directly towards the crime scene. Your affiant observed that on June 18, 2020, at approximately 1944:12 hours, an individual dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt, black shorts, black shoes and white ankle socks is observed walking south bound in the 1500 block of Valentia Street along the west sidewalk. The individual walks towards the rear of an occupied food truck which is parked along the west curb line of Valentia Street just north of Colfax Avenue. Your affiant could observe at least three unknown individuals are standing on the west side of the vehicle and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The suspect, dressed in black clothing, then quickens their pace and jogs to the rear driver's side of the food truck with both of their hands pointing what is now known to be firearm at individuals standing along the driver's side of the food truck. Your affiant could observe that the suspect was discharging the firearm but could not observe who he was firing at due to the food truck blocking the view. At 1944:15 hours, your affiant observed two individuals run from the bullets fired by the suspect to the front of the food truck where both parties fall to the ground. One of the fleeing individuals is wearing all black clothing and the second a white shirt. The party wearing the all black clothing is able to get to their feet and the party wearing the white shirt, now known to be victim Asian Fair (040571), remains on the ground. The suspect then flees the crime scene north bound on foot and out of the camera view. It should be noted that the individual who had fell to the ground with the victim while trying to avoid being struck by fired bullets had fled the scene prior to police arrival and is yet to be identified.

At 1123 hours, your affiant received a telephone call from [REDACTED] who identified herself as [REDACTED]. During the conversation, [REDACTED] informed your affiant that the victim had already undergone three surgeries to repair the internal damage caused by the fired bullets and was scheduled to undergo a fourth surgery on June 23, 2020. [REDACTED] then stated that [REDACTED] had been told that the shooting suspect was known by the moniker "Money GD" and that he was a member of the Gangster Disciples criminal street gang. [REDACTED] continued that [REDACTED] had learned from an unknown source that on June 18, 2020, the victim had given a courtesy ride to an individual who had had a conflict with the shooting suspect. [REDACTED] related that the suspect did not know exactly who he was shooting at and had only observed the victim arrive in the 1500 block of Valentia Street operating the same vehicle that he had given the unknown individual a ride in. [REDACTED] added that [REDACTED] had been informed that the suspect had only recognized the victim's vehicle and did not personally know Asian Fair (040571).

On June 23, 2020, your affiant conducted a review of the surveillance video footage captured from the cameras located at 1525 Valentia Street. Your affiant noted that the time stamp associated with the video footage is approximately six minutes behind the actual time of events. During the review, your affiant observed that on June 18, 2020, at approximately 1937 hours, a white four door sedan is observed turning from east bound Colfax Avenue to north bound Valentia Street. At 1944 hours, your affiant observed an individual walking south bound in the 1500 block of Valentia Street along the west sidewalk. The party is wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, black shorts, black shoes and white socks. Your affiant also noted that the party had the hood of the sweatshirt pulled up over their head. As the individual nears the [REDACTED] food truck, he quickens his pace and walks to the rear driver's side of the

vehicle. The suspect then produces a handgun from his right front sweatshirt pocket and points the weapon towards individuals standing along the driver's side of the food truck. The parties being assaulted on the driver's side of the food truck are not visible on the video due to the vehicle blocking the camera view. Your affiant could observe flashes of light emitting from the handgun as the suspect discharges rounds and then observed two individuals attempt to flee from the assault and fall to the ground directly in front of the food truck. One of the parties is wearing all black clothing and the second is wearing a white shirt. Your affiant knows that the individual wearing the white shirt is in fact victim Asian Fair (040571). At 1946 hours, your affiant observed the suspect flee the shooting scene west bound through the north parking lot of 1525 Valentia Street and north bound in the 1500 block alley of Valentia Street/Unita Street. As the suspect fled the scene through the parking lot of 1525 Valentia Street, your affiant observed that the suspect was wearing a white shirt underneath the hooded black sweatshirt and appeared to have an ankle monitor of his right leg. The suspect appeared to be an African American male with the hood of his sweatshirt pulled up tight over his head.

On June 23, 2020, at approximately 0825 hours, your affiant received a telephone call from [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. During the conversation, [REDACTED] informed your affiant that "Money GD's" true name was Dwan West and added that he lived at 4933 Scranton Street.

Based on the information learned from [REDACTED] your affiant searched Denver Police Department records for information related to Dwan West. Your affiant located Dwan Kennedy West (031086) who had a documented address of 4933 Scranton Street. Your affiant then queried Dwan West (031086) within the NCIC/CCIC database and learned that he had a suspended Colorado driver's license with an address of 4933 Scranton Street. Your affiant also noted that Dwan West (031086) had an [REDACTED]

Your affiant then searched the Lumens database for additional information concerning Dwan Kennedy West (031086). [REDACTED]

On June 23, 2020, your affiant spoke with [REDACTED]

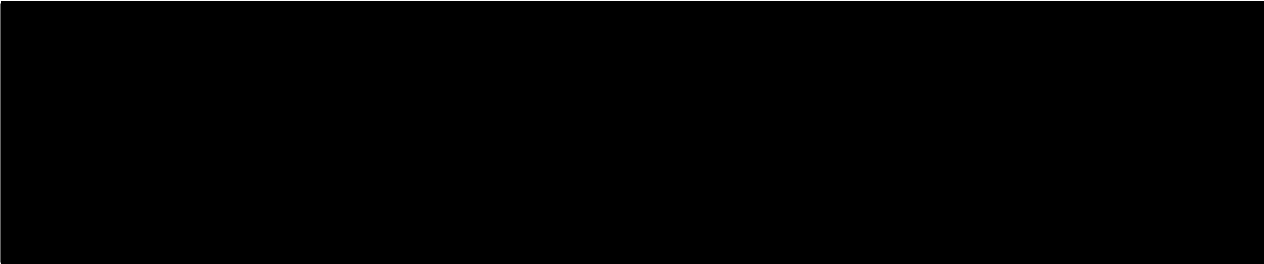

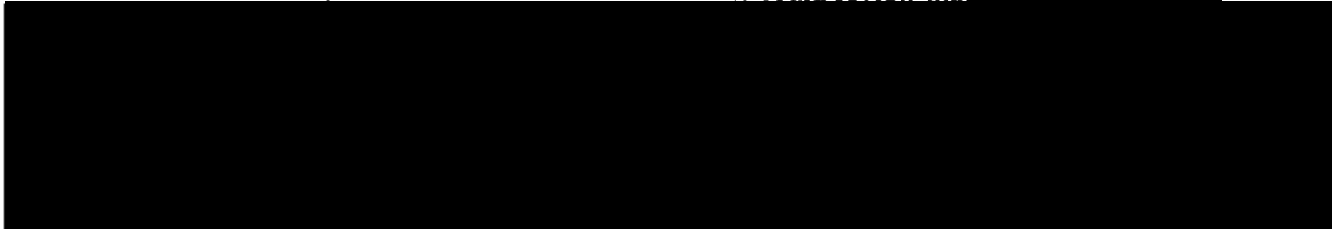

On June 24, 2020, your affiant contacted Denver Probation Officer Mark Yamashita via telephone. During the conversation, your affiant asked Yamashita if he could review the

At 1019 hours, Detective Bruce Kay 04056 and your affiant responded to the Dollar Tree store located at 4923 E. Colfax Avenue. Upon arrival, Detectives met with the [REDACTED] who was identified as [REDACTED]. Detectives explained to [REDACTED] that they were hoping that the store's surveillance cameras may have recorded video images of a suspect that they were currently looking for. [REDACTED] then allowed Detectives to review the surveillance video recorded by the cameras on June 18, 2020. Upon accessing the video system, your affiant noted that the time stamp associated with the recorded video was approximately one hour behind the actual time. While reviewing the video, your affiant observed a male, believed to be Dwan Kennedy West (031086), enter the front door of the location at

On June 24, 2020, at approximately 1238 hours, your affiant received a report completed by personnel assigned to the Denver Police Department Crime Laboratory Firearms Unit. The drafted report stated that the [REDACTED]

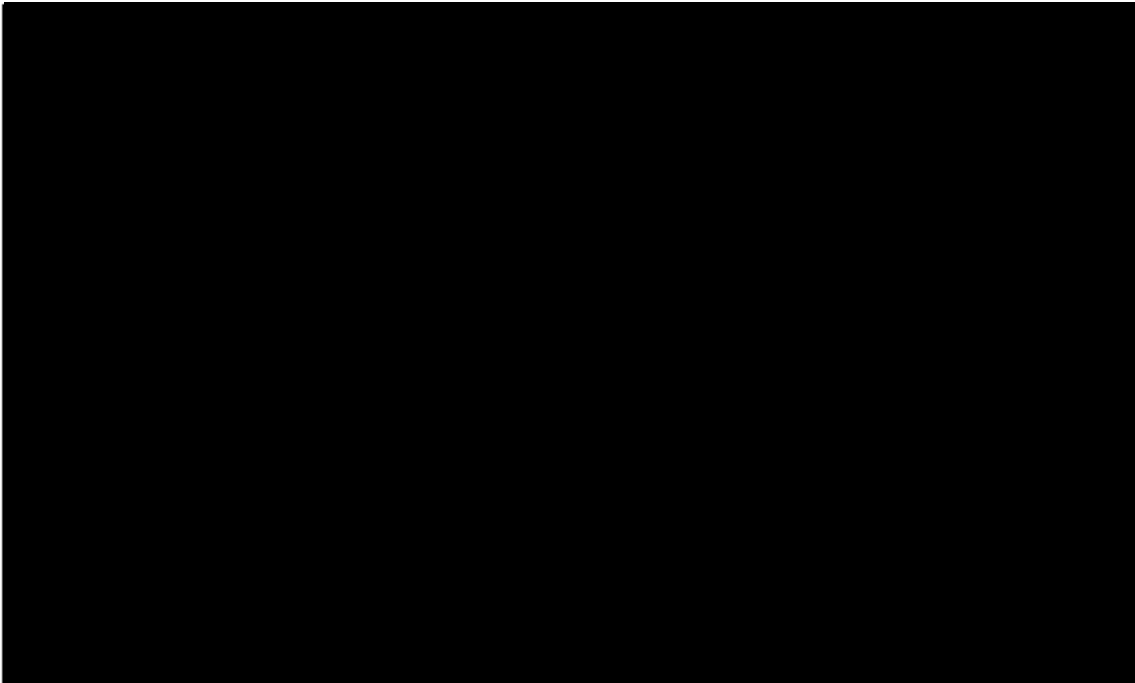
At 1240 hours, your affiant conducted a review of DPD case number 2020-378831 which was titled Aggravated Assault. During the review, your affiant learned that on 062120, at approximately 2256 hours, Officers from the Denver Police Department responded to 23 [REDACTED] Oneida Street on a report of a fight with weapons involved. Upon arrival, Officers contacted [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) who was extremely agitated and uncooperative. [REDACTED] refused to provide Officers with information and Officers then conducted an interview with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]). During the interview, [REDACTED] related that [REDACTED] had been jumped, struck with a handgun, and that two gunshots had possibly been fired prior to the suspects fleeing the scene. Officers also learned that prior to the suspects fleeing the scene, they had unintentionally dropped a firearm which was then recovered by the victim's family. Officers took possession of the firearm recovered by the family during the incident and noted that [REDACTED] did have injuries consistent with being assaulted. Officers identified the recovered firearm as a [REDACTED], and was discovered to have been reported stolen on DPD case number [REDACTED]. Based on [REDACTED] refusal to cooperate with the investigation, Officers completed a Letter to Detectives and placed the recovered firearm into the Denver Police Department Property Bureau on invoice number 1121976.

Following the review of DPD case number [REDACTED], your affiant accessed the Visinet database and obtained a copy of the Incident Detail Report generated by the City and County of Denver Communications Center reference DPD case number [REDACTED]. Your affiant reviewed the Incident Detail Report and noted that one of the 911 callers had informed the call taker that the suspect in the incident was associated to a white sedan with unknown license plates. The caller then described the suspect as being a dark skinned African American male, late twenties to early thirties, bald, approximately 5'7" in height. The information detailed in the Incident Detail Report was of importance to your affiant due to the [REDACTED]

At 1251 hours, your affiant contacted Denver Probation Officer Mark Yamashita and requested that he review of the [REDACTED]

At 1306 hours, your affiant received an email from Denver Probation Officer Mark which contained five maps depicting the [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) on June 21, 2020. The five maps detailed the following information.



[REDACTED] on June 21, 2020 (DPD case number [REDACTED]) and the [REDACTED] to the shooting incident on June 18, 2020, in the 1500 [REDACTED]. The information directly connects Dwan West (031086) to the firearm utilized during the attempt murder of Asian Fair (040571).

On June 25, 2020, your affiant responded to Denver Health Medical Center and attempted to conduct an interview with victim Asian Fair (040571). Upon arrival, your affiant learned that the victim was still unable to speak and was not able to comprehend or respond to conversation.

Based on the information detailed within the affidavit, your affiant respectfully requests that an arrest warrant be issued for Dwan Kennedy West (031086) for the criminal offenses of Criminal Attempt Murder in the First Degree, Assault in the First Degree, Illegal Discharge of a Firearm and Possession of a Weapon by a Previous Offender.
