AND WHEREAS the Court has examined the attached affidavit and has satisfied itself that there is probable cause to believe that the above-named offense(s) has been committed by the above-named person

AND WHEREAS the Affiant, Denver Police Homicide Detective Brian Lang, 03014, has requested that a **SEALED ARREST WARRANT** be issued for the above-named person **Jonathan Alberto Nuno Mijangos (07/17/1997)**, so this investigation can continue and so that the witnesses mentioned in this warrant can be protected from any type of early reprisals.

**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT
AND THE ARREST WARRANT FOR THE PERSON(S) OF:**

**Jonathan Alberto Nuno Mijangos (07/17/1997) a White Male, 5'5", 145 lbs, Brown Eyes, Black Hair, Colorado Driver's License Number 16-084-0654
For C.R.S. 18-3-102 (1)(a) Murder in the First Degree a Class 1 Felony**

I, Detective Brian Lang #03014, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above-named person(s), are the following:

Your Affiant obtained the following information by personal observations, interviews, witnesses, discussions with fellow officers and by reviewing official police reports of the Denver Police Department.

On March 11th, 2021, Detective Teresa Gessner was notified of an active missing persons case. Detective Gessner spoke with Detective John Brinkers of the Denver Police Missing and Exploited Persons Unit and learned the following. On March 10th, 2021, the suspect, Jonathan Alberto Nuno Mijangos 07/17/97, had called Denver Police Dispatch to report his wife, [REDACTED], as a missing person.

Jonathan told the responding officer that he had last seen his wife at their residence, 7588 E 28th Ave Unit 2, Denver Colorado 80238, on Tuesday March 9th, 2021 at approximately 9 am before he left for work. Jonathan reported [REDACTED] had texted him on the 9th to say she was going out with friends later but did not supply any further information. Jonathan told the officer that [REDACTED] phone and car were still at their residence. Jonathan stated he last saw [REDACTED] wearing a grey shirt and blue shorts which are "[REDACTED]".

At 6:17 pm on March 10th, 2021, a call came into Denver Police Dispatch from a party identifying himself as [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported he had talked to a neighbor, later identified as [REDACTED], who told him the following. The neighbor reported hearing a loud bang like someone had been thrown and then saw Jonathan Nuno move his wife's car out of the garage and then move his car into the garage.

Detective Curtis Johnson and Detective Marika Lawrenson went to 7588 E 28th Ave and attempted to make contact at the Nuno's residence with no answer. Detective Johnson and Detective Lawrenson contacted the neighbor in [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported the following information. On March 9th at 11 am [REDACTED] were in [REDACTED] apartment when they heard a loud boom from [REDACTED] apartment and the Nuno's dog started barking. [REDACTED] described the boom sounded as if a body hit floor. [REDACTED] later saw [REDACTED]'s car, a red Mini Cooper CO plates [REDACTED] parked in the shared garage space. At approximately 10 pm [REDACTED] noticed that Jonathan Nuno's car was parked in the garage and [REDACTED] Mini was not there. [REDACTED] left to pick up her husband about 11

pm and on her return at 1230 am on the 10th she saw [REDACTED] car in the garage and Jonathan leaning into the trunk of his car parked on the west side of the street. [REDACTED] reported the interior garage lights were off and they are never turned off. [REDACTED] had noted Jonathan was carrying a black backpack. [REDACTED] reported her husband works [REDACTED] and she normally leaves about 1130 pm to pick him up.

Detective Jerry Lara contacted [REDACTED] work supervisor [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported they have been working remotely and was able to verify through the company IT department that [REDACTED] had logged into her work computer at 5:30 am on March 9th and had never logged out. [REDACTED] stated she had last received an email from [REDACTED] at 9:30 am on Mach 9th. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] is very reliable and would notify her if [REDACTED] had to miss work.

Detective John Brinkers spoke with [REDACTED] who reported she had plans to meet [REDACTED] on Tuesday March 9th, 2021 at 7 pm but [REDACTED] had not appeared and had not contacted [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained she had planned to pick [REDACTED] up from her apartment at 7 pm. [REDACTED] arrived and called [REDACTED] to let her know that [REDACTED] was out front. [REDACTED] stated she did not know which apartment [REDACTED] was, so she did not knock on any doors. [REDACTED] did not answer the call and [REDACTED] sent a follow up text and called again with no response. [REDACTED] then left.

Detective Brinkers interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported a history of domestic violence with Jonathan having been previously arrested for domestic violence against [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported he had been given permission by Jonathan to go into the apartment and had found [REDACTED] phone, credit cards and knee brace all still in the apartment. [REDACTED] sated he has a very close relationship to [REDACTED] and does not believe she would leave town without telling him.

Detective Gessner located Aurora Police Department case 201925760. In this report [REDACTED] stated her husband of five months, Jonathan Nuno 07/17/97, had physically assaulted her during an argument. [REDACTED] had reported Jonathan pinning her to the bed and slapping her before grabbing her throat with one hand and causing her to have difficulty breathing. [REDACTED] reported Jonathan then grabbed one loose end of a key lanyard that had been underneath her and held it across her throat and again caused difficulty breathing. In this case Jonathan was charged with Second Degree Assault.

Detective Gessner learned from Sergeant Brian Cotter of the Denver Police Missing and Exploited Persons Unit, that historical call details records had been obtained on Jonathan's cell phone. The call details records included a history of cell phone signals from Jonathan's cell phone to cell phone towers. These signals can then be plotted on a map and indicate where the phone had been at the time of that signal. The signals from Jonathan's cell phone were plotted on a map and indicated the following [REDACTED]

Detective Brinkers interviewed Jonathan Nuno. Jonathan reported he last saw his wife on the morning of March 9th before he left for work. Jonathan reported he was late to work on the 9th because he had car trouble. Jonathan said he left for work at approximately 9:30 am and received a text from [REDACTED] at 10 am stating she was going out with friends that night. Jonathan stated he no longer had that message because he deletes his messages every month. Jonathan initially stated he never left the residence after

returning home from work on March 9th until he left for work after calling the police on March 10th. When confronted with the cell phone location report Jonathan recalled having left his residence around midnight and [REDACTED] east on I-70 to the area of Tower Rd or Smith Rd area. Jonathan initially denied stopping but then stated he stopped on Smith Rd before returning home.

Based on the information gathered from Jonathan's historical call details records a search was conducted in the area of the cell phone tower signals. On March 12th, 2021 a body was located in an area consistent with these cell phone tower signals. A body was located on the south side of E 26th Ave laying in a gulley approximately six feet from the street. The body was wrapped in black plastic bags with duct tape on the feet, legs, torso and head area. There was loose field grass and dirt placed on top of the black plastic bag that wrapped body in an attempt to conceal the black plastic bag and body. Detective Gessner was notified by Detective McGrail that the medical examiner, Dr Puffenberger, had pronounced the time of death at 1:05 pm, on March 12th, 2021. Detective McGrail viewed the body and noted the body was wearing a grey shirt and blue shorts which is consistent with Jonathan's description of what he had last seen [REDACTED] wearing.

Based on the aforementioned information, Your Affiant respectfully requests that a probable cause warrant be issued for, **Jonathan Alberto Nuno Mijangos (07/17/1997)**
