[REDACTED] **for One (1) count of Murder in the Second Degree, Felony Murder 18-3-103(1)(b), a class 3 Felony, and One (1) count of Aggravated Robbery, 18-4-302 (1)(d), a class 3 Felony**



I, Detective Neil BAKER, 04026, Your Affiant states under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above-named person(s), are the following:

Your Affiant, Detective Neil BAKER badge number 04026, has been a Police Officer for over 31 years. Your Affiant is currently assigned to the Denver Police Department, Major Crimes Division, Homicide Unit. Your Affiant's primary duties are to conduct investigations related to homicides, officer involved shootings, and other death investigations. Your Affiant has held this position since September 2018. Prior to this assignment, Your Affiant obtained the following investigative experience:

- From April 2017 to September 2018, Your Affiant was assigned as a Detective with the Denver Police Department, Major Crimes Division, Sex Crimes Unit. Your Affiant conducted investigations related to sexual assault, indecent exposure and enticement of children.
- From June 2015 to April 2017, Your Affiant was assigned as a Detective with the Denver Police Department, Major Crimes Division, Missing and Exploited Persons Unit. Your Affiant conducted investigations related to physical abuse to children, sexual abuse to children by person in a position of trust and investigations in relation to child pornography. Your Affiant has had

training from the Rocky Mountain Forensic Computer Lab on information that can be recovered from computers and other computer components.

- From November 2012 to June 2015, Your Affiant was assigned as a Detective with the Denver Police Department, District 6 Investigations. Your Affiant conducted investigations in relation to burglaries, thefts, criminal impersonations, identity theft, felony assaults and strong-arm robberies.

On **February 20, 2023**, at approximately **10:56 AM**, Denver police officers responded to the area of E. Evans Ave. and S. Monaco St. on a report of the "Nature Unknown". Prior to their arrival, Denver Police Dispatch informed officers that there is a person down behind an abandoned building. They were informed that the person was face down in the parking lot and was last seen wearing a black puffy jacket.

Upon officers' arrival, they found a deceased white male on his knees with his head on the ground the middle of the parking lot behind 6565 E. Evans Ave. The male was pronounced deceased at **11:03 AM** with a possible gunshot wound to his back.



At approximately **11:05 AM**, your Affiant received a phone call on the Homicide Unit Hotline from Denver Police Officer HALIBURTON, 17028. Officer HALIBURTON explained that she was in a parking lot behind 6565 E. Evans Ave. with a deceased male who was apparently shot in the back. She advised that there was no gun on the scene and there was possible video evidence from an apartment building to the north of the parking lot.

Your Affiant arrived on scene and observed the male on his knees in a fetal position with his face on the ground.

Your Affiant observed his shirt pulled up and a small puncture type wound on his back.

Your Affiant was informed that officers were searching the area around 6565 E. Evans Ave. This location is an abandoned building which used to be a bank. There is a chain-link fence around the building with openings in the fence making the area unsecured.

Your Affiant was informed by Detective Chris FAYLES that video footage from the apartments on the north side of the bank show three individuals walking into the rear north facing door of the bank at approximately **5:08 AM**. At approximately **5:19 AM**, the victim is seen fleeing out of the same back door entrance and was falling to the ground. The victim was seen crawling through the parking lot westbound to the location where he was found deceased.

Your Affiant was also informed that right after the victim fled the north door of the bank, 2 other individuals can be seen leaving after the victim and fleeing eastbound through the parking lot.

Your Affiant was informed that Denver Police Metro SWAT was responding to secure the abandoned bank building before officers and investigators could enter to process the scene.

As SWAT officers were clearing the building, your Affiant was informed that a male and female were taken into custody in a small room of the basement of that abandoned bank. Both the male and female were taken outside by SWAT officers and placed into separate police vehicles.

Your Affiant advised officers to transport both parties to Denver Police Headquarters.

Your Affiant was informed by Detective FAYLES that upon entering 6565 E. Evans Ave., a single shell casing was located inside of the bank near the North door where the victim was seen exiting.

Your Affiant interviewed Isaac REINER 9/2/99. REINER advised that he has lived at the abandoned bank for several weeks. He advised that he was invited to stay there from a friend that he met who also lives there. He said that this person's name was [REDACTED] and that he did not know his last name.

REINER said that he was at his friend's house who he knows as [REDACTED] earlier that night. He said that his first name was [REDACTED], but he did not know his last name. He said that [REDACTED] lives at Havana and Parker Road. He said that he came home to the abandoned bank early that morning and went downstairs to his room where [REDACTED] was staying. She was identified as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was later identified by REINER and [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] and will be referred to as [REDACTED].

REINER said that he heard a gunshot at around **5:30 AM** inside of the bank. He said that he left his room in the basement and went upstairs. He said that he observed a fat Mexican male wearing a gray hoodie, jeans and a mask over his face standing by the north door and then this person fled out through the door. He said that he never saw a gun or anyone else with him. He also said that he never saw [REDACTED]

Your Affiant interviewed [REDACTED] who said that she was sleeping in the [REDACTED] [REDACTED], REINER. She said that he [REDACTED], asking her if she heard the gunshot. She said that he told her that "[REDACTED]" shot his gun outside and wanted to know if she heard it. She stated that she did not.

Your Affiant re-interviewed REINER and confronted him with the information provided by [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. He was confronted with the fact that [REDACTED] said that he asked her if she heard "[REDACTED]" shoot a gun outside.

REINER then changed his story and said that the fat Mexican male was known to him as "[REDACTED]" and [REDACTED] was not there. When confronted further, REINER finally admitted that [REDACTED] was there with "[REDACTED]". He stated that he does not know who "[REDACTED]" is. He advised that "[REDACTED]" lives in the Same Apartment Complex as [REDACTED].

REINER said that he walked home from [REDACTED] apartment at Havana and Parker Road. He said it takes about an hour to walk that distance. He said that he got to the bank and went downstairs to his room. He said that he heard a loud door slam and then went back upstairs. As he was climbing the stairs, he heard, who he thought was "[REDACTED]", telling [REDACTED] to empty his pockets. When he got upstairs, he saw [REDACTED] holding a gun towards [REDACTED] and shoot [REDACTED] in the chest area. He said that [REDACTED] started to scream and ran out the north door. He said that [REDACTED] then followed behind [REDACTED] and "[REDACTED]" followed [REDACTED] through the north door. He said that he does not know where they went from there.

REINER said that he then went back downstairs and did tell [REDACTED] about [REDACTED] shooting his gun. He said that he asked her if she heard it and she said no. He said that [REDACTED] was sleeping.

Your Affiant showed REINER a photograph of a white Dodge Durango. The vehicle was seen on video surveillance at the apartments just north of the bank. Three individuals are seen getting out of the vehicle and entering the north entrance of the bank. Two individuals are seen fleeing the bank and getting into the white Durango at the time of the shooting. REINER said that he does not know who owns that Durango. He said he is never seen it before.

Your Affiant asked REINER what phone number he has for [REDACTED]. He said that he doesn't remember the phone number, but it is in his phone because he has texted him. He said that it starts with a [REDACTED]-area code.

Your Affiant located a Facebook account for [REDACTED]. The information page states that he lives in Aurora Colorado and is from Oklahoma City. There are photographs of a black male posing.

Your Affiant knows from experience that the [REDACTED]-area code is Oklahoma City.

Your Affiant printed a single photograph taken from the Facebook page. Your Affiant showed the single photograph to REINER who stated that the person in the picture was [REDACTED]. REINER signed the photograph identifying [REDACTED] as the person who shot [REDACTED].

Your Affiant re-interviewed [REDACTED]. She was asked how many times she has seen [REDACTED] and she said several times. She was asked if she saw him walking in a crowd of people, could she pick him out. She said that she could. Your Affiant showed the single photograph to [REDACTED], and she immediately said that it was [REDACTED]. She also signed the photograph identifying him.

Your Affiant re-interviewed REINER. Your Affiant advised REINER that there were video cameras on the apartment complex north of the bank. He was advised that video cameras showed the previously discussed white Durango parked in the parking lot there. He was advised that three people can be seen exiting the white Durango and entering the bank through the north entrance. He was advised that his cellular phone collects location data and that location data will be obtained to know where he was for the entire night.

Your Affiant advised REINER of his Miranda rights. Reiner signed a written advisement of his rights stating that he understood them. [REDACTED]

Your Affiant asked REINER again for the truth. REINER said that [REDACTED]

Your Affiant asked REINER if there was a plan [REDACTED]

Your Affiant showed a photograph of the video surveillance which shows the white Durango backed into a parking space. It also shows three individuals walking away. [REDACTED]

REINER says [REDACTED]

REINER said that [REDACTED]

Your Affiant asked REINER if he did go through [REDACTED] belongings. He said [REDACTED]

REINER explained to your Affiant [REDACTED]

It should be known that the first text message from [REDACTED] to REINER was at **7:16 AM**, well after the murder. There are no other text messages prior to this time which your Affiant believes were erased.

Your Affiant asked REINER if he ever went outside to check on [REDACTED] knowing that he was shot in the chest. [REDACTED].

Your Affiant confronted REINER with the fact that [REDACTED]

He was confronted with a text message that he sent to a person named [REDACTED]. The text message was sent at [REDACTED] on [REDACTED], **2023**. The message says:

“Yo these gang bangers I know just ran that pussy ass bitch mother fucker out of this place and now I have his laptop and everything he owns now. Ha ha I need your help getting my

computer today bro please I'm already meeting [REDACTED] after 4 that she has all my stuff that crime supposedly lost".

REINER [REDACTED]

Based on the above investigation, there are reasonable grounds to suspect that Isaac Austin REINER was in contact with the victim, [REDACTED] at 5:19 AM on February 20, 2023, and that he and his co-defendants, [REDACTED] and "[REDACTED]", robbed the victim, [REDACTED] at gunpoint before he was shot and killed by his co-defendant, [REDACTED] at 6565 E Evans Ave.

Based on the foregoing information, Your Affiant respectfully requests that a warrant be issued for

Isaac Austin REINER dob: 09/21/1999, White Male, 5'06", 150lbs, Blonde Hair, Hazel Eyes, [REDACTED] for One (1) count of Murder in the Second Degree, Felony Murder 18-3-103(1)(b), a class 3 Felony, and One count of Aggravated Robbery, 18-4-302 (1)(d), a class 3 Felony so the suspect can be apprehended, and the investigation continued.
