I am a police officer for the City and County of Denver, Colorado, and have knowledge regarding the arrest of the above named party for the below listed offense, which offense occurred on the date of 02/20/20 at 10:45 a.m. p.m. at the location of West Colfax and I-25 in the City and County of Denver, State of Colorado.

Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver; Violation: VEH ELUDING, 18-9-116.5- F5

Probable Cause:

On February 19, 2021, at 7:50 p.m., DPD Officers responded to the McDonalds located at 2850 W Alameda Avenue on a report of a shooting. Employees advised Officers that a dark colored Honda pulled up to the drive-up window. An occupant in the Honda became engaged in a dispute with the employee at the drive through. An unknown male exited the Honda from the front passenger seat and started to menace employees in the store by pointing a handgun at them. The Honda pulled forward and three shots were fired into the occupied restaurant. Surveillance cameras captured the Honda Accord, bearing Colorado license plate , which was reported stolen out of Aurora and involved in a shooting in North east Denver on February 18, 2021.

On February 20, 2021, at 10:45 p.m. DPD Officers responded to a shooting at West Colfax Avenue and I-25. When Officers arrived, they found an unknown female sitting in a 2008 Land Rover SUV, bearing Colorado license plate . The land Rover was sitting in lane #3 facing west. The female, who has been positively identified as, Pamela Cabriales, dob: 1988 was suffering from at least one gunshot wound to the head. Cabriales was transported to DHMC by ambulance. Her prognosis is not good, she is in extremely critical condition. Cabriales was the driver and sole occupant of the Range Rover. The Range Rover has eight bullet defects in the windshield. A witness to the shooting described the suspect vehicle as a four-door dark colored Honda. The witness observed the suspect standing next to the passenger side of the car and fire a gun six times into the Range Rover. The witness said the suspect vehicle then traveled west on Colfax Avenue. Two spent 223 shell casings were recovered from the street in front of the Range Rover.

On February 21, 2021, at approximately 12:01a.m., District Four Officer Katie Phillips, 19066, observed a dark colored four door Honda traveling north on Federal Blvd near exposition. Officer Phillips observed a large dent in the driver's side of the Honda, and she recognized this car as the car that was involved in the shooting at the McDonalds. Officer Phillips had seen still videos of this car, taken from the McDonalds surveillance system. Officer Phillips got behind the Honda and was able to confirm this was the suspect vehicle based off of the license plate . Officer Phillips aired the suspect vehicle information and began following and airing her direction of travel. Officer Phillips activated lights and siren and the driver refused to stop. At approximately 12:03 a.m., Officer Phillips indicated the suspect car was traveling north on Tejon Street, passing Alameda. The suspect car crashed into a large wooden pole on Tejon Street about a block north of Alameda, knocked a fire hydrant off of its base, and slammed through a chain link fence and came to rest in the front yard of W

Byers Place. Officer Phillips called out that three males got out of the suspect car and ran. Officers immediately set up a perimeter. Members of the DPD Metro Swat and K-9 units responded and conducted a search for the three suspects that ran from the vehicle. Neshan Johnson was found hiding in a shed behind [REDACTED] W Byers Place. After taking Johnson into custody, a search was conducted of the shed. Sixteen live rounds of 22 caliber ammunition and 1 223 caliber shell casing was recovered from the floor area of the shed.

Detective Smith observed the suspect vehicle (Honda) at [REDACTED] W Byers place. In plain view in the back seat are 2 AR-15 rifles.

[REDACTED], dob: [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], dob: [REDACTED] were also taken into custody within the perimeter that was established.

At 5:20 a.m., Detective Lou Estrada began a video recorded interview with Neshan Johnson, dob: 03/19/2002. Johnson said [REDACTED]

At 10:00 a.m., Detective Marty Smith started a video recorded interview with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. They chose to not talk about this investigation.

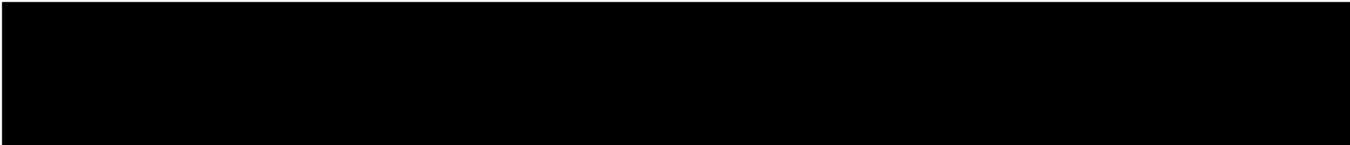
At 10:40 a.m., After Juvenile advisement Detective Estrada began a video recorded interview with [REDACTED], dob: [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said They were at Colfax Ave. and I-25 when they stopped at the intersection of westbound W. Colfax Ave. and the off ramp of south bound I-25 when a car hit them from behind. He was with "Rashon" aka – Nashon Jackson, dob: 03/19/2002 and [REDACTED] aka – [REDACTED], dob: [REDACTED]. Rashon was driving [REDACTED] was in front passenger seat, and he was sitting in the back seat of the dark colored four door Honda. When the vehicle hit them, [REDACTED] asked Rashon if he could "bust on them". He [REDACTED] explained this meant to shoot at the car who had just hit them. Rashon told [REDACTED] he could. [REDACTED] got out of the car, pointed the AR-15 at the car that hit them and began shooting. He stated [REDACTED] shot seven times. As [REDACTED] was shooting, some of the spent casings were landing inside the car. After the shooting, [REDACTED] got into the car, threw the AR-15 in the back seat where he was. Rashon drove west on W. Colfax Ave. [REDACTED] stated he later fell asleep in the back of the car as Rashon was driving and was later woken-up by [REDACTED], who told him the police were chasing them.

[REDACTED] stated Rashon was driving too fast, crashed the car, and he got out and walked away. He later met up with Rashon, was later contacted by the police, and taken into custody.

During the interview, [REDACTED] viewed a photo array and positively identified Nashon Johnson – aka "Rashon" as the driver of the Honda. [REDACTED] viewed a single photo of [REDACTED] and positively identified [REDACTED] as the individual he saw shooting the AR-15. (LAE)

At 12:48 p.m., Detective Estrada began another video recorded interview with Neshan Johnson. Johnson then [REDACTED]

Johnson said [REDACTED]
