



**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT
AND THE ARREST WARRANT FOR THE PERSON(S) OF:**

Glasby, Adam 08- [REDACTED], Blk Male, 6' 0" 215 lbs. Brown eyes, Blk hair for the following charge(s):

- One count of Assault in the Second Degree, C.R.S. 18-3-203(1)(g), which is a class 4 felony.

I, Sergeant Randy Steinke 94025, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed within the jurisdiction of the City and County of Denver, and that the offense was committed by the above-named person(s), are the following:

Your Affiant (a Police Officer for twenty-nine years and currently assigned to the Denver Police Department Internal Affairs Bureau) received case number 2023-312323.

On June 13, 2023, the Internal Affairs Bureau, received a Use of Force Report completed by District 1 Patrol Sergeant Chris Archuleta, P06134.

Sergeant Chris Archuleta reported that on June 13, 2023, at approximately 0045 hours, Denver Police Officer Adam Glasby, P17014, and Denver Police Detective [REDACTED], were working secondary employment at Hayter's & CO located at 1920 Blake St. where they witnessed a group of males physically fighting in the street and went to intervene to stop the ongoing assault. Officer Adam Glasby stated he pulled a party away from the fight, took him to the ground, and the party went unconscious. Officer Adam Glasby reported that he immediately began efforts to render aid to the party, which included a sternal rub. The party woke up and was walked away by his friends.

Officer Adam Glasby reported to Sergeant Chris Archuleta that he did not call for an ambulance nor did he immediately report the incident to a supervisor until approximately 0800 on June 13, 2023. He also stated that his body worn camera had fallen off his uniform and therefore, he does not have body worn camera footage.

Detective [REDACTED] reported to Sergeant Chris Archuleta that he observed a fight and officer Adam Glasby had run towards the assault and he followed. Detective [REDACTED] stated he took out his mace and told parties to stop fighting or they would be sprayed. The parties dispersed and he turned back towards officer Adam Glasby providing aid to a party. Detective [REDACTED] observed the party get picked up by his friends and they walked away. Detective [REDACTED] did not immediately notify a supervisor, nor did he call an ambulance for the party.

AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT

On June 14, 2023, [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) responded to Denver Police Headquarters and requested to speak with the Internal Affairs Bureau. Sergeant Laura Franklin conducted an interview with [REDACTED] who reported that he was at Hayter's with a group of friends. He had gone outside with two (2) friends outside of Hayter's & CO and stood there waiting for the rest of their friends to come outside so they could leave. While waiting, his friend, [REDACTED], was bumped into by multiple parties physically fighting. The parties then engaged in a physical fight with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] tried to help [REDACTED] by striking an unknown male. [REDACTED] stated he then took a couple of steps back when he was picked up and thrown to the ground. [REDACTED] stated he went unconscious and when he woke up he was surrounded by seven to eight people he did not know. His friend [REDACTED] helped him up and took him to Denver Health Medical Center for treatment.

[REDACTED] reported that he was diagnosed with a subarachnoid hemorrhage, concussion, and nerve damage. [REDACTED] had visible injuries to include an abrasion on his forehead and a bump on the back of his head. Dr. Yannestos at UC Health University of Colorado completed a DPD serious bodily injury form and found that [REDACTED] suffered serious bodily injury due to a substantial risk of protracted loss or impairment of the function of any part or organ. Specially, [REDACTED] was diagnosed with traumatic brain injury as a result of subarachnoid hemorrhage.

Sergeant Randy Steinke obtained video footage from the Denver Police Department High Activity Low Observation (HALO) cameras that are located at 1900 Blake St. The HALO camera captured a fight break out in the front of Hayter's & CO. [REDACTED] is observed running toward the fight and throwing a punch to an unknown party. He then backed away when officer Adam Glasby came up behind him, grabbed him, picked him up and threw him to the ground. [REDACTED] landed on his back and neck where he then lies still. Officer Adam Glasby knelt beside [REDACTED] and rolled him onto his side before rubbing his sternum to wake him up. At the same time, Detective [REDACTED] is seen walking from the bar into the street after parties that are still engaged in the fight. The parties disperse and Detective [REDACTED] turned around, approached officer Glasby and [REDACTED], who is still on the ground. A small crowd gathered around [REDACTED], and he is seen standing up approximately two (2) minutes later. He then walked away with the assistance of his friends.

July 26, 2023, Assistant District Attorney Zach McCabe reviewed the case and after review advised to obtain a probable cause arrest warrant.

Based on the aforementioned information, your Affiant respectfully requests that an arrest warrant be issued for the suspect (Glasby, Adam [REDACTED]) to continue this investigation.
